


Nunthorpe Primary Academy Sports Premium Planned Expenditure 2017/18

The Sports Premium is an amount of money allocated to schools to improve the quality and breadth of P.E. and sport provision. Schools are free to determine how best to use the funding to improve the quality and breadth of P.E. and sport provision within their school, including increasing participation in P.E. and sport so that pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

At Nunthorpe Primary Academy we will use the money to improve and focus on two main areas:

- Increased participation and enjoyment of P.E. for all pupils during lessons and extra-curricular opportunities.
- Provide our children with the earliest opportunity to swim at least 25m and continue to develop their swimming ability outside of school.

In **2017/18** Nunthorpe Primary Academy expects to receive an **£17,820 grant**. We will spend this funding on the following projects. Some additional funding will be allocated from the school budget to supplement additional needs and ensure we encourage and provide all our pupils with the opportunity to develop healthy lifestyles. We aim to increase the participation in, and improve the enjoyment of, P.E. and sport.
