Nursery PEADING






Flashing Fire Engines follows the animal crew, as they become fire fighters. Climb on board the fire engine, ride along and learn how to put out fires to save the day!








A simple rhythmic text introduces the children to a menagerie of wild animals from a roaring lion to a fluting flamingo and a trumpeting elephant.






A beautifully illustrated text, exploring different animals and their colours. The colourful collages and simple repetitive language make this story a favourite with our children.




