

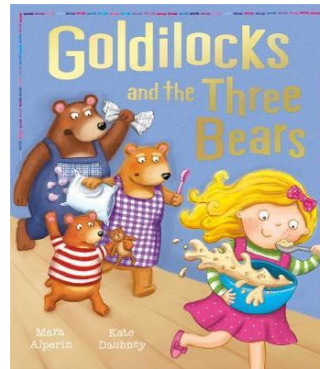
NURSERY READING

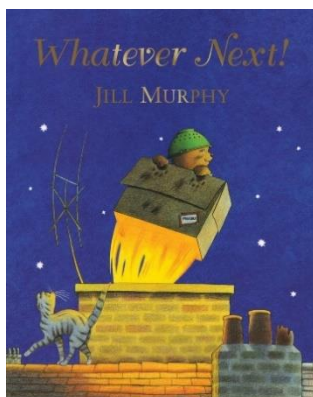
We're Going on a Bear Hunt

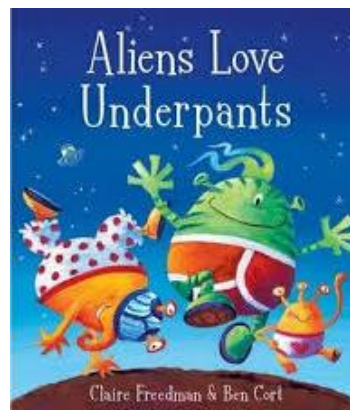
Follow this family's excitement as they wade through the grass, splash through the river and squelch through the mud in search of a bear.



When Goldilocks sneaks into the three bears' cottage, no one seems to be home. The bears soon return from their walk... Will they catch the person who has eaten their porridge?

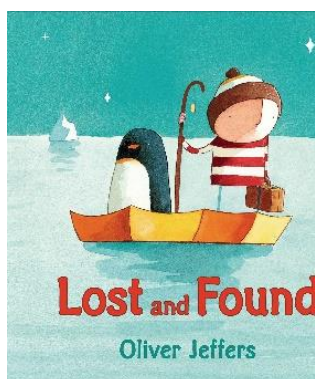

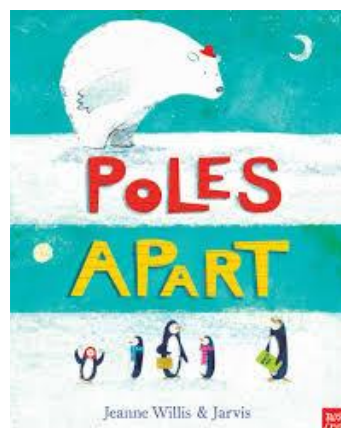


Aliens love underpants, in every shape and size, but there are no underpants in space, so here's a big surprise...

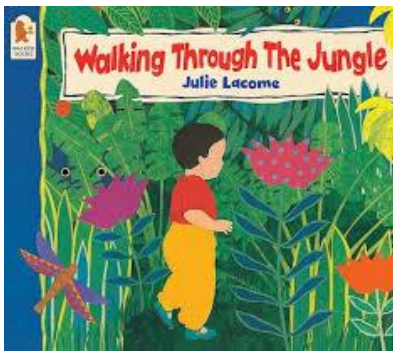
Read a fun story about aliens stealing underpants and causing lots of mischief.



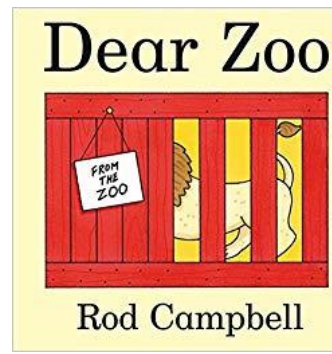

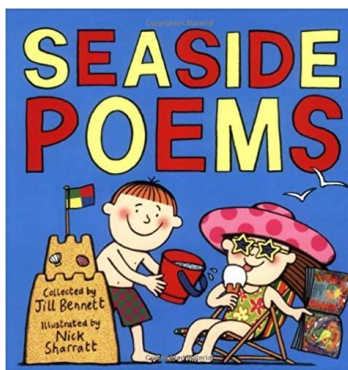
A lift the flap story which encourages children to discover the animals the zoo has sent – a monkey, a lion and even an elephant! But will they ever manage to send the perfect pet?



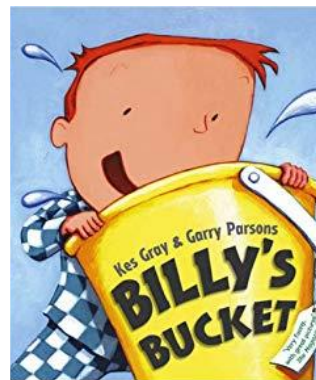
In this alternative tale, Jasper plants a bean. He waits for it to grow into a beanstalk all week. How long will he have to wait before he can start looking for giants?
