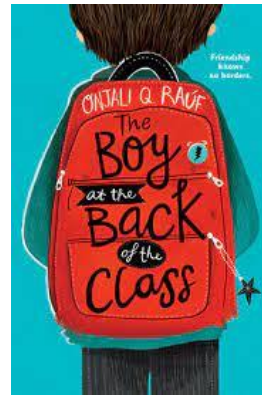


YEAR 6 ♥ READING

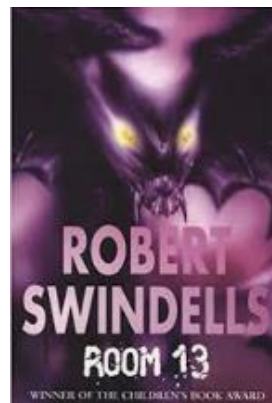
Linked to our World War 2 topic in Autumn 1, we read Michael Morpurgo's story about two evacuees who make a discovery on the moors.



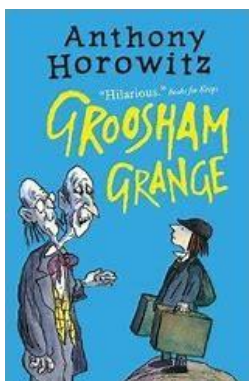

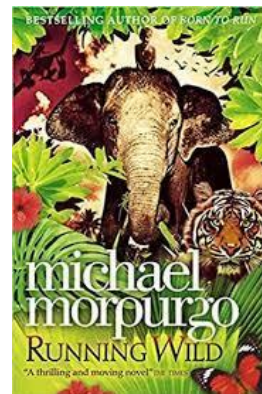
During Autumn 2, we read the Charles Dickens classic, A Christmas Carol. A great story to read in the run up to Christmas.



As we start to look at writing suspense in the spring term, we read Room 13 which is a story about a group of children who stay at a spooky guest house on Whitby's West Cliff.



By the popular author Anthony Horowitz, we explore the story of David, who is sent to Groosham Grange by his parents. He soon discovers that his new school is a very strange place indeed.



Written by Michael Morpurgo, Running Wild is a story about the adventures of a young boy who has to survive in the Indonesian jungle after being saved from a tsunami by an elephant. A great story to end Year 6.
