Under Section 444 (1) of the Education
Act 1996, it is the responsibility of the
parent to ensure that their child
regularly attends school. Failure to do
so is an offence. Parents whose
children regularly arrive late could be
deemed as failing in their
responsibility to ensure regular
attendance at school and can be
issued with a Penalty Notice or even
prosecuted in the Magistrates Court.

Ironstone Academy Trust has high expectations for all students and monitor attendance and punctuality closely. If we are worried about your child's punctuality we may contact you to discuss any issues you may be having. If your child is regularly late we may invite you into school to talk about how we can best support you and your child so we can work together to improve the situation.

What Can Parents do?

Encourage your child to prepare for school the night before. Pack your school back and make sure they have everything they need.

Encourage your child to get into the habit of doing homework the night before.

Have a good bedtime routine so your child has plenty of rest.

Invest in a reliable alarm clock and encourage your child to help get themselves ready in the morning.

Ensure your child has a drink and some breakfast before leaving home, OR take advantage of the Academy breakfast club (make sure you book)

Allow plenty of time to get to school

In case of emergency - have a back-up-plan friends/family/neighbours who can help out

Call the Academy as soon as possible.
